2024-2025 Report

Based on the 2023-2024 report, we shared a survey with RIN members to identify prioritized activities. Below, we note progress on these prioritized activities.

Objective 1: Collaborate with other interest networks

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> Evaluate process of travel award management in collaboration with SECP and AAIDD office.

<u>Progress:</u> We did not pursue this activity this year, as it was not identified as a priority in our survey (no progress)

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> Collaborate with SECP to identify supports that would benefit individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities in student/early career roles [diversity, equity, inclusion, justice].

Progress: We did not move this activity forward (no progress).

Funds used: \$0

Objective 2: Support students

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> Provide financial support for travel awards to AAIDD, with a focus on students and early career professionals interested in research.

<u>Progress:</u> We provided 2 scholarship for SECP. To identify recipients, we engaged RIN members in abstract review.

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> Co-host SECP pre-conference Research Colloquium, and collaborate with SECP leadership to create a program that best meets the needs of diverse students and early career professionals.

Progress: We co-hosted the SECP pre-conference Research Colloquium. This included 8 presenters. RIN

members compiled feedback for presenters. The Research Colloquium was attended by over 30 people.

Funds used: \$1000 (\$500/award)

Objective 3: Advance the field

Planed activity 1: Host a webinar on a topic in IDD research.

Progress: This was not prioritized and did not occur.

<u>Planned activity 2:</u>Make a plan to provide small scholarships for student groups to support inclusive research in 2026 (for example, a small \$500 scholarship to provide compensation to researchers with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities working on a student project).

<u>Progress:</u> We drafted the guidelines for this scholarship and met with AAIDD leadership to discuss steps to administer the scholarship in 2025-2026.

<u>Planned activity 3:</u> The RIN will explore opportunities to co-sponsor webinars/seminars with other related organizations (e.g., AUCD, IDDRC) to enhance collaboration and dissemination in the field.

Progress: This was not prioritized and did not occur (no progress).

Funds used: \$0

Objective 4: Promote the mission, goals, and principles of AAIDD

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> Establish supports for a member of the RIN Leadership with an intellectual and/or developmental disability and elect a member with intellectual and/or developmental disability to have a RIN Leadership position. This position will receive a stipend to compensate them for their work.

<u>Progress:</u> One individual with an intellectual and/or developmental disability served as a Member at Large. They were supported by another Member at Large at the same institution. Future work will include a clear plan for supports that can be implemented in absence of another RIN Leadership Member at the same institution.

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> Discuss an approach for raising funds for individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities to become AAIDD members and RIN members. This may include having the IN fee waived and/or having an option for IN members to pay an additional fee that goes towards membership of an individual with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.

<u>Progress:</u> This was not completed.

Funds used: \$500 (stipend for Member at Large)

Objective 5: Improve communication

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> Using the membership list, invite RIN members to participate in RIN events and contribute to annual planned activities (e.g., reviewing for student awards, serving as mentors at the SECP Research Colloquium).

<u>Progress:</u> The RIN membership was engaged in abstract review (6 members outside of RIN Leadership) and asked to serve as mentors at the SECP Research Colloquium (4 members)

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> Using the media outlets of AAIDD (newsletter, Facebook), advertise RIN events and relevant scholarly events and activities of RIN members.

<u>Progress:</u> This was not completed.

Funds budgeted: \$1000 (\$500/award)

Objective 3: Advance the field

<u>Planned activity 3:</u> Distribute a spreadsheet or online form to support RIN members to identify other members with shared interests. Members will opt into signing up and can use the spreadsheet to identify potential research collaborations or peer-to-peer mentoring/support relationships.

Funds budgeted: \$500

Funds budgeted: \$750 (stipend + additional supports)

Objective 5: Improve communication

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> Using the membership list, invite RIN members to participate in RIN events and contribute to annual planned activities (e.g., reviewing for student awards, serving as mentors at the SECP Research Colloquium).

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> Host biannual membership meetings to improve communication. The focus of these meetings will be to: a) Share information about RIN activities and gather feedback, and b) Solicit increased member engagement in activities.

<u>Planned activity 3:</u> Using the media outlets of AAIDD (newsletter, Facebook), advertise RIN events and relevant scholarly events and activities of RIN members.
