During this time, we identified that an alternative activity to promote access for researchers with I/DD was to explore more about best practices for plain language summaries and abstracts. The RIN executive committee began discussing a process to explore best practices in the creation of plain language summaries and abstracts, and developed a plan to systematically gather information from other journals and organizations in 2022-2023.
